NYC design students help 'Sandy' families

In October 2012, Hurricane Sandy devastated the greater NYC area, hitting towns along the Jersey shore, the Rockaways and the coast of New York's Long Island, Some FIT (Fashion Institute of Technology) students were displaced for a few weeks. Natalie Zepeda, Long Beach, Long Island, was one of them. Natalie was inspired to take on a mission to help families whose homes were severely damaged by the storm. It was then that the Interior Design Relief Project was established at FIT.

With measuring tape in hand, the professors and students met with the families in Long Beach, Long Island to discuss their needs. At the end of the process each family received a proposed design package that included AutoCAD drawings, renderings of proposed designs and an inspiration board that included color layouts, finishes and furniture selections.
